

Our 2022 Pilot Season

- 18 weeks of fresh local produce from Hartford area farms
- Aggregate seasonal produce both fruits and vegetables
- Approximately 30 participants are enrolled

Our Market Segment

- 12,000 Hartford households ≥ \$75K annual income
- 8,050 households in North End ≤ ALICE annual income
- 34,000 households in inner ring Hartford suburbs



Our Key Customers

2022 Projections

<u>Initial</u>

60 full season shares $(60 \times $540) = $32,400$ 15 half season shares $(15 \times $270) = $4,050$ 15 subsidized shares $(15 \times $270) = $4,050$
